#### **Purslow Sports Show and Gymkana**


Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> July from 12.00. Admission £5.

#### Wednesday 26th July

An exploration into the world of Acanthus and other plants in the Acanthus family. A talk by Ingrid Mellington from Hillview Hardy Plants.



Ingrid Millington started Hillview Hardy Plants nursery on a one-acre plot in Worfield in 1987 and since then it has become well-known for its collections of plants.

Her husband, John, joined the nursery in 1992 and their daughter, Sarah Millington, decided to go into horticulture and the family business in 2002.

The nursery is known for propagating and selling 300 different types of Primula Auriculas Alpines and 200 different varieties of Primula Auriculas bred by Richard Austin, from the New Forest. It also specialises in rare and unusual herbaceous perennials at the nursery.

Her talk to the Club will be an exploration into the world of Acanthus and other plants in the Acanthus family. Ingrid was awarded RHS Master Grower status at the Malvern Show this Spring.
