Clun Carnival and Show



An exploration into the world of Acanthus and other plants in the Acanthus family. A talk by Ingrid Millington from Hillview Hardy Plants.



This month's fascinating talk is by Ingrid Millington of Hillview Hardy Plants. Hillview Nursery is a family affair. Ingrid started the nursery on a one-acre plot in Worfield in 1987. Her husband John joined in 1992 and in 2002 their daughter, Sarah also joined the business.

The nursery is known for propagating and selling over 500 varieties of Primulas and Auriculas. They also specialize in rare and unusual herbaceous perennials. At the Spring Malvern Show she was awarded the prestigious RHS Master Grower status.

As holder of the national collection of Acanthus, Ingrid is truly an expert on the subject of the talk this month. She has travelled all over the world to see species in their natural habitat. A tough and essential part of the herbaceous border that thrives in both sun and shade, it will be fascinating to explore this surprisingly varied family in more depth. Not to be missed!
