

The talk will be given by Dr Michael Jones, now retired as Head of Science at Newman University, Birmingham. He is an enthusiastic botanist with a particular interest in parasitic plants. Mistletoe is a strange, parasitic plant. It is poisonous yet used in the treatment of cancer. Theres so much more to know about the folklore and use of this unusual plant, other than getting caught under it at Christmas! This talk will be accompanied by a festive drink (tea and coffee also available), and of course, a mince pie. Everybody welcome. Christmas starts here!
