These Trillium are a symbol of the three founders: Osgood Mackenzie who was given 12,000 acres of barren, rocky land on the shores of Loch Ewe in the 1860s; his daughter Mairie who committed to enhancing the garden from



1922 and finally the National Trust which was given the garden in 1952. We might grumble about flooding, soil types, pests and diseases but we should take heart from people who have created a wonderful garden in such a challenging and exposed situation, on the same latitude as Labrador!

#### **Minsterley Meadows Appeal**

Two flower-rich meadows on the eastern outskirts of Minsterley, designated by Natural England as a Site of Special Scientific Interest have come up for sale. The Middle Marches Community Land Trust has had an offer of £190,000 accepted and is now trying to raise the funds by October 19<sup>th</sup>. The Trust is dedicated to helping create an ecologically healthy and sustainable countryside and has developed a reputation over recent years for purchasing and managing areas for conservation including Cudwell Meadow, Norbury Hill and High Leasowes. The Minsterley Meadows are the largest site for Green-Winged Orchids, Orchis morio, in Shropshire. If you would like to find out more, go to

The appeal aims to raise a total of £240,000 to cover the cost of the purchase, Land Management work and support development of the community group. #### **Hereford Cathedral and Kenchester Water Gardens**



Leaving BC (lay-by at the Community College) at 9am. Private tour of the 15c Cathedral Gardens spread over four acres, includes Courtyard, Cloister & Vicars Garden, Choral Garden, Deans Garden and Bishops Garden. Split into two private tours 11am and 12 pm. The latter two gardens are not usually open to the public. Extra time for enjoying other areas of the cathedral such as The Mappa Mundi and Chained Library (optional - tickets to be bought by individuals for £7.50, no need to book in advance). There are also tours of the Tower at 11.30 and 1.30 but these timings would not fit with the garden tours (no need to book in advance; £8) There is an excellent cafe or you could bring your own packed lunch, but save room in your tummy for afternoon tea included in the price at:

2.15 pm we make our way to Kenchester Water Gardens which is justifiably proud of being the Holder of the National Collection of Hardy Water Lilies. There are over two hundred varieties, most of which are available to buy as potted plants. We will have time to relax with tea/coffee and cake and stroll around the beautiful water gardens, visit the nursery and shop before leaving at 4.30. Arrive back at BC approximately 5.30 pm.

Paul Green of Greens Leaves started supplying plants back in 1994 and rather than emulate many other nurseries already in existence, decided to specialise in rare and unusual plants from around the world, suitable for growing in the UK. By far the majority of plants the nursery supplies are grown in the Gloucestershire nursery and any new varieties are always tested for hardiness given the UK's demanding climate.
