#### **Pearl Garden**



Many thanks to Sandy and Sara who joined me in a maintenance session recently. As you can see from the before and after photos, much weeding was sorely needed! Buttercups are very pretty and good for wildlife but may not impress





visitors to the hall, especially as we are a gardening club! The garden was designed to be low maintenance so we only need to have a tidy-up about four times a year, ideally in early March, May, end of July and end of October. If you are a relatively new member of our club, you may be unaware of the Pearl Garden. It was created to celebrate thirty years of our club from 1987 to 2017. One of our ex-committee members Sara Metcalf, kindly designed the space and chose the plants, using her experience as a garden designer. We commissioned a local artist Nick Burns, to create a sculpture for us



We have lost quite a few of the original plants over the years so I think we will need to fill the gaps soon. Perhaps members could keep an eye open for plants from their own gardens which could be split and donated? I fear part of the problem is caused by the bed being on top of the bank so some soil may be washed down the hill. Perhaps we need some edging to keep the soil in place? Sandy, Sara and I definitely felt the bed would benefit from a good mulch this Autumn. If anyone more expert than me has some suggestions — they would be gratefully received.

#### **Minsterley Meadows Appeal**

I have included this again in case you did not see it last month. We asked for a show of hands at our last meeting and received a positive response. If you have any thoughts, please let me know (by email, phone or on the trip).

Two flower-rich meadows on the eastern outskirts of Minsterley, designated by Natural England as a Site of Special Scientific Interest have come up for sale. The Middle Marches Community Land Trust has had an offer of £190,000 accepted and is now trying to raise the funds by October 19<sup>th</sup>. The Trust is dedicated to helping create an ecologically healthy and sustainable countryside and has developed a reputation over recent years for purchasing and managing areas for conservation including Cudwell Meadow, Norbury Hill and High Leasowes. The Minsterley Meadows are the largest site for Green-Winged Orchids, Orchis morio, in Shropshire. The appeal aims to raise a total of £240,000 to cover the cost of the purchase, Land Management work and support development of the community group. #### **Hereford Cathedral and Kenchester Water Gardens**



Leaving BC (lay-by at the Community College) at 9am. Private tour of the 15c Cathedral Gardens spread over four acres, includes Courtyard, Cloister & Vicars Garden, Choral Garden, Deans Garden and Bishops Garden. Split into two private tours 11am and 12 pm. The latter two gardens are not usually open to the public. Extra time for enjoying other areas of the cathedral such as The Mappa Mundi and Chained Library (optional - tickets to be bought by individuals for £7.50, no need to book in advance). There are also tours of the Tower at 11.30 and 1.30 but these timings would not fit with the garden tours (no need to book in advance; £8) There is an excellent cafe or you could bring your own packed lunch, but save room in your tummy for afternoon tea included in the price at:

2.15 pm we make our way to Kenchester Water Gardens which is justifiably proud of being the Holder of the National Collection of Hardy Water Lilies. There are over two hundred varieties, most of which are available to buy as potted plants. We will have time to relax with tea/coffee and cake and stroll around the beautiful water gardens, visit the nursery and shop before leaving at 4.30. Arrive back at BC approximately 5.30 pm.
