#### Irises in the Natural Garden - a talk by Alun and Jill Whitehead



Jill and Alun Whitehead have created their three-acre garden at Aulden Farm over 20 years, selling a wide variety of plants from their nursery and they hold a large collection of Siberian Iris. Being keen plantaholics means that over the years a depth of knowledge has been built up especially in irises. In 2007 an old collection of Siberian Iris fell into neglect and they couldn't let the history just disappear so acquired the remaining plants and re-established it, with many additions, as a new National Collection. It now has approximately 150 cultivars and proves to be a useful resource for photographers as well as other irisiarians. They also act as the Collection Co-ordinators for Plant Heritage in Herefordshire and have been Hardy Plant Society members for over 20 years.
