Pruning Wisteria - Wednesday 15th January 10.30am - 1.30pm

A practical workshop learning how to summer and winter prune your Wisteria. Learn how to renovate old Wisteria and train new plants too.

Pruning Roses - Wednesday 5th February 10.30am - 1.30pm

A practical workshop learning how to prune different types of roses including climbers and ramblers, learn how to get the best from your roses in terms of health and flowers.

Pruning Clematis - Wednesday 19th February 10.30am - 1.30pm

Participants will learn about the different types (groups) of clematis and then have a practical session pruning the different groups of clematis in the garden.

Pruning Shrubs (incl. Hydrangeas) – Wednesday 5th **February 10.30am – 1.30pm** A practical look at pruning shrubs including different types of Hydrangeas. A hands-on session working on the varied shrubs and hydrangeas in the garden.


